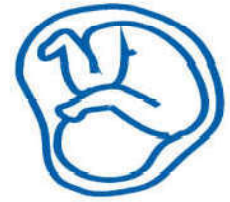

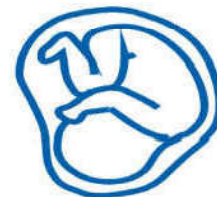

A: "I just want to make sure I'm understanding --"

Q: "And I --"

A: "-- you correctly."

Q: "And I want to -- I want you to. So, thank you for asking me.

I just -- I'm asking whether you then consider the services that you perform, the abortion services you perform at EMW as being part of your responsibilities at the University of Louisville?"

A: "I would say yes and no to that question. Yes, because, you know, I was hired, you know, by the University of Louisville in order to provide not only general obstetric and gynecological care but also to, you know, fulfill this family planning position and provide abortion services. But, you know, I guess it's sort of I guess like a joint endeavor, I guess. You know, that -- I consider it part of my -- part of my job. That's what the University of Louisville hired me to do. But, you know, EMW is just part of my job responsibilities."
