

U of L's "Grand Rounds" infamy re: U of L and Abortion

Is this person really an "expert in women's health care" or is he just another abortionist who is a part of the abortion establishment?

"Grand Rounds" is the title given to a prestigious lecture series presented to medical staff in teaching hospitals. Two weeks ago, on Feb. 28, the Grand Rounds lecturer at the University of Louisville was Dr. David Eisenberg, the medical director of Planned Parenthood of the St. Louis Region and Southwest Missouri. Under his medical leadership, many questions have been raised about the facility. One report, in 2017, stated that at least 62 women had been taken by ambulance to local hospitals over the previous seven years as the result of complications from abortion treatment at his facility.



Upon investigation, the Missouri Department of Health and Senior Services found numerous violations, everything from failing to report abortion complications to the health department to ignoring the basic protocol of washing your hands between patients.

Is this who the University of Louisville should be elevating (and paying)? Is this who residents should be asked to emulate? Is this where our tax dollars should be going -- to Grand Rounds lecturers like this?
